Gresham Barrett was sworn in as a member of the 108th Congress on January 7, 2003. Later that week, Gresham learned he will serve on both the House Budget Committee and the House Financial Services Committee. Representative Barrett is committed to working with fellow members of Congress, as well as President Bush, to fight for tax cuts, support our military, protect the homeland, reform frivolous lawsuits, and strengthen and protect families.

Gresham graduated from The Citadel in 1983. After graduation and completion of Airborne school, he accepted a commission as Second Lieutenant in the Field Artillery, First Cavalry Division, Fort Hood, Texas. As a veteran, Gresham will work to strengthen the military and keep our commitments to those who have served the cause of freedom. When it comes to our men and women in uniform, Gresham will never cut corners. He will work to put the safety and security of American families and interests first.

Following service to his country, Gresham resigned his commission as a Captain and returned home to Oconee County to assume responsibility for the family business.
