He has served as a management consultant to state governments and as legislative staff to a county council. He is currently an adjunct faculty member of the University of North Carolina's School of Public Health and holds an appointment as a senior scholar in environmental policy at The Strom Thurmond Institute of Government and Public Affairs at Clemson University. He holds graduate degrees in city planning, political science and engineering management and an undergraduate degree in civil engineering. He is a diplomate of the American Academy of Environmental Engineers and a member of the American Institute of Certified Planners.
