Lindsey Graham was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives in 1994 and became the first Republican to represent South Carolina's Third Congressional District in Washington since 1877. He has now completed his fourth term in Congress where he worked to bring fiscal responsibility to the federal government, eliminate the excessive tax burden on families and reduce federal regulations which restrict local governments and businesses. Before being elected to Congress, Graham compiled a distinguished legal career in the U.S. Air Force and he continues to serve his country as a Lt. Colonel in the Air Force Reserves. In November 2002, Graham defeated Democrat Alex Sanders 54 percent to 44 percent in the race to succeed Strom Thurmond in the U.S. Senate. In January 2003, he will be sworn in as South Carolina's next United States Senator.
